

## **FY2011 Military Construction and Veterans Affairs Authorization Requests**

**Project Title:** Joint Deployment Processing and Readiness Center-Phase One  
(Training Operations Center)

**Intended Recipient:** Air National Guard

**Intended Location:** Eastover, South Carolina

**Project Description:**

The 169<sup>th</sup> FW (flying 24 PAA F-16CM aircraft, and one C-130H Fighter Support Aircraft) requires an adequately sized, properly configured and sited Reserve Operations Training Facility. Functional areas within the Operations Training Center include space for the air commander, administration, environmental manager, public affairs, safety, support group commander, judge advocate, diversity, family services, accounting and finance, comptroller, contracting, chaplain, historian, personnel, social actions, counseling, recruiting, environmental, base training, testing room, conference area, classrooms and an auditorium. The Honor Guard requires space for training, storage and administration. The auditorium can be used for large audience gatherings by both ANG and ARNG without duplicating facility requirements. This resolves a long-standing ANG MILCON requirement that has been included in previous FYDPs, although packaged differently in previous submissions. The current facility contains significant structural and functional defects that make it imprudent and uneconomical to repair. Without this project, training opportunities will continue to be lost due to organizational inefficiencies and good deployment command and control will be difficult to achieve. Quality of work space will be difficult to improve, adversely affecting morale, readiness, and recruiting and retention.

**Project Title:** Satellite Fire Station and Law Enforcement Activity Facility

**Intended Recipient:** Fort Jackson

**Intended Location:** Fort Jackson, SC

**Project Description:**

To construct a satellite fire station and law enforcement activity facility on Fort Jackson, South Carolina. Fort Jackson currently has no satellite fire station or law enforcement activity facility. There are no adequate permanent facilities available either on or off of the installation that can be utilized to satisfy Army requirements. The fire department has a five minute response time requirement and as new BCTs are constructed it will be increasingly impossible to meet this requirement. This project will enhance activity missions through improvements in command and control efficiencies and effectiveness and centralization of functions. If this project is not provided, the Public Safety Office and Law Enforcement Activity will not be able to adequately accomplish all of their assigned duties and missions. This will result in losses in both efficiency and effectiveness and also lead to general degradations in and impairments of functional and operational activities, compositions, and capabilities.
